House Rules

- General:
 - These House Rules are provided to assure the all Members and their guests can fully enjoy their experience at Wolf Laurel Country Club. The General Manager may authorize exceptions to these rules on a case-by-case basis when circumstances warrant.
- Decorum:
 - The Club seeks to provide a friendly and enjoyable atmosphere for all its Members and guests. All are requested to maintain an appropriate level of decorum and respect others using the Club. Loud conversation and behavior that may disturb the privacy of others is not appropriate.
- Attire:
 - Members, their children, and their guests are expected to be in appropriate attire at all times. It is the responsibility of the members to see that their guests are so informed.
 - Gentlemen are not permitted to wear hats in the dining room at any time. Hats are permitted in the pro shop and lounge
 - Sports attire is acceptable throughout the club except in the dining room on fine-dining nights. Tank tops, short shorts, and pants with holes are inappropriate
 - Men's shirts are to be tucked in at all times with the exception of resort style casual wear (i.e. tropical shirts). Crewneck dress shirts are acceptable but tee shirts and slogan tee shirts are not acceptable in the dining room and dining deck. Sweat suits, sweat shorts or sports team jerseys are also not acceptable attire in the dining room and dining deck.
 - Denim wear is generally acceptable provided that such wear is clean and free of holes.
 - On evenings designated as "fine dining", members are encouraged to dress appropriately when dining in the Dining room or on the Dining deck. Wearing of shorts is discouraged.
- Guests:
 - Members are responsible for the conduct of their guests including their adherence to these House Rules.
- Children:
 - Members are responsible for the behavior of their children. Parents are reminded that their children are held to the same standards of respect, decorum and dress code, as are the members.
- Smoking:

- Smoking is only permitted at the Club on the deck immediately adjacent to the pro shop.
- Firearms:
 - Firearms and other weapons are not permitted at the Club including the clubhouse grounds.
- Pets:
 - Pets, with the exception of service dogs, are not permitted in the dining room, on the dining deck or in the lounge.
- Alcohol:
 - The club is licensed to serve liquor, wine and beer. In accordance with state law, no alcoholic beverages may be consumed on the Club premises which are not purchased from the Club. An exception to this policy is made for Members bringing personal wine to the Club when a corkage fee is paid and the beverages are served by the Club staff.
 - No alcoholic beverages may be served or consumed by anyone under the age of 21.
 - Management has the right and responsibility to refuse to serve alcoholic beverages for an appropriate reason.
- Commercial advertisement:
 - The Club facilities shall not be used for business advertisement or solicitation unless authorized by the General Manager.
- Member Directory:
 - The information contained in the Club Directory is provided solely for the personal use of Members and shall not be used for solicitation.
- Cell phones:
 - Use of cell phones is not permitted in the dining room or on the dining deck. This includes no ringing phones or music tones. Please put your cell phone on silent/vibrate when entering the club and step outside if you need to use your cell phone.
- Dining reservations:
 - Reservations are strongly recommended when dining at the Club. This is particularly important for parties larger than four. The staff will endeavor to accommodate Members arriving without reservations, however, those with reservations shall have priority in seating and service.
- Communication with employees:
 - Members, their children and guests are to treat employees of the Club with respect. No one is to reprimand, criticize or direct staff members. If an issue arises, bring it to the attention of the appropriate manager.

CLUB RULES 6-29-15

Resigned members returning as guests renting from a non-club member

Should a resigned member, or spouse, in good standing who does not own a dwelling within one hundred miles of the Club, wish access to club facilities during a two week period annually, they and members of their immediate family may have use of the club in accordance with their golf or social membership status upon resignation. Golf cost will be charged as accompanied guest and restaurant charges will be authorized by credit card. These previous members will be considered "house guests" in accordance with Article XI GUEST PRIVILEGES.

Number of Golf Rounds for Social Members

Any member becoming or joining as a social member in 2010 or after shall be allowed to play golf three times a year. Any member becoming or joining as a social member prior to 2010 are grandfathered in 12 rounds of golf per year. The social members are required to pay applicable green fees and cart fees.

Golf play by non-member who is a property owner

An individual who is the owner of a dwelling within twenty five miles of the club may use the golf facilities as a guests three times a year.

Country Club Use by Local Guests

- Members may invite non-members in Madison County and Yancy counties to be an accompanied guest a maximum of four times per year.
- Tenant guests renting from a non-WLCC member are entitled to two rounds of golf and two dining privileges.

Golf Facility Fees and Charges

Golf facility charges shall be posted in a prominent location within the pro shop. All golf facility fees and charges shall be set by the board of directors and/or club manager at its discretion.

Reactivation fee for membership from redemption list

Upon an approved application and the payment of two thousand dollars (\$2000) [golf] or one thousand dollars (\$1000) [social] a resigned member who has not received his/her equity will be removed from the redemption list and returned to active status within the same classification they resign from. Dues and food minimum will be prorated to the time of application acceptance. This club rule for reactivation can only be used one time.

Reactivation fee for resignation in a calendar year.

No reactivation fee will be charged for those members choosing to reactivate their membership in the calendar year in which they resigned. Dues and assessments will be charged for that calendar year.

Change of classification from social to golf membership

Owners of social memberships may make an application to the board in change classification to a golf membership if one is available. Upon the approval of the application, holders of social memberships who joined after 2012 may be classified as golf members upon payment of the difference between the current costs of a social membership and a golf membership. (Per the bylaws Article IX Paragraph 13) Holders of social membership who joined before 2012 may be classified as golf members without any additional cost, (this does not include transferred memberships). Dues for the year will be prorated. If a social member upgrades to golf, the member must pay golf dues for at least a year before he can transfer a golf membership. He can transfer a social membership in that year.
